Nirdhan at a Glance

Nirdhan Utthan Bank's main objective is to create progressive, better socio-economic status of the poor people through awareness, access to finance and entrepreneurship development. Microfinance program of the Bank started since March 14, 1993 when it was working as NGO, later transferred to Microfinance Bank in 1998. At present, Nirdhan is the only MFI in Nepal that has outreach in 75 districts of Nepal through the network of 178 Branch Offices, 10 Regional Offices and a Central Office serving 301,531 clients as of December 15, 2017.

Success Story: Ms Dhani Thapa

Ms Dhani Thapa was born in Bhur Rural Municipality, Jajarkot District and her family depended on subsistence farming. Being the eldest child in her family, she had the responsibility of looking after her young brother and two sisters. Due to poverty she could not join school and helped her parents on household chores. Her father died when she was eight years old, and she had added responsibility to support her widowed mother.

She got married at the age of 15 and moved to Chaurjahari Municipality. Her husband's extended family's income from agriculture could last them for only six months. She started livestock, poultry and goat farming with the support of her family, Her responsibilities grew over time as she gave birth to 5 kids. Her family struggled to meet ends and she experienced difficulty to continue education for her kids.

During the same time, Nirdhan Utthan opened Chaujahari Branch. She joined as a member of Gharigaun Independent Womens Group – 4 and enrolled for financial literacy program organised by Nirdhan and Mercy Core. After completing the program, she was determined and motivated to convert her traditional farm to operate it in commercial scale. She obtained loan from Nirdhan Utthan and started poultry farming. As the entrepreneurship started to be profitable, she was encouraged to expand it. The income started to grow which helped her to cover household expenses and her kid's education.

She has been continuing her livestock and poultry farming and she admits the income from her entrepreneurship is sufficient to cover her kids education and loan repayment commitments.

Training on Goat farming was organized in Palpa District by NUBL Bhairahawa Regional Office for 20 member clients of Jabgadi, Aryabhanjyang, Bastari and Chahara Branch from December 13-15, 2017. Training was a part of the project, "Job creation through Micro and Small Enterprises Financing with Support from Financial Literacy, Entrepreneurship & Skill Trainings" implemented by NUBL in partnership with SAKCHYAM - Access to Finance, a UKAID funded project.

Training on Clean Dairy Production and Diversification Organized in Birgunj

Training on clean dairy production and diversification was organized in Birgunj, Parsa District by Nirdhan Birgunj Regional Office for 25 clients of Parwanipur, Prasauni, Birgunj and Kalaiya Branch from December 31, 2017 – 2 January, 2018.

The training focused on providing information on milk's components and importance, clean milk production and quality testing techniques, ideas on reducing milk production expenses and importance of cleaning dairy equipment. Likewise, participants also learned about cream separation, pasteurization, packaging, and procedures on producing different dairy products among other skills.
