The publication by Education Ministry, Education in Figures 2017 shows that there are 3.97 million students studying in class 1-5 and there are 1.87 million in Class 6-8 while 172 thousand students are dropouts by the time they reach class 8 as out of 794 thousands who joined in class 1, only 622 thousand would join in class 8 leaving 21.63% dropout rate. The main reason for the children not being able to attend school or forced to drop out seems to be the poverty and lack of awareness among parents. We pledge ourselves as

Nirdhan Conducted Skill Development Trainings for clients

Nirdhan Utthan Laghubitta Bittiya Sanstha Limited organized **7 training events** with the aim to provide business skills and entrepreneurial skills in opportunities such as Goat Farming, Vegetable Farming and Cow/Buffalo husbandry. Nirdhan organized 4 Commercial Goat Farming Training in Paraspur, Khajura, Dhakdhai and Tulsipur Branches with a

total of 120 members' participation. Goat Raising Training offers insights on all the important matters to be considered by farmers for healthy goat production. Further, the training programs also included visit of a well established exemplary goat farm to give a practical experience of successful goat raising ideas.

Further, Nirdhan organized 2 Commercial Vegetable Farming trainings through the institutes branch offices of Khurkot & Bijuwar. The trainings focused on seasonal and off-seasonal vegetable farming at a commercial scale. The trainers had a wide range of information and great training skills through which the members of Nirdhan were highly motivated and learned new skills. Lastly, there was one Training on Poultry Farming in Sandhi-

kharka Branch which provided new set of skills and ideas to the poultry farmers from that region.

The trainings organized by Nirdhan are never short of ideas and information and to achieve these objectives and to make the training program a successful one, Nirdhan hires professionals as trainers rather than providing the training through the staffs. Also, the trainings are intensive trainings with 3 days of both practical and theoretical ideas sharing which results in proper understanding of the overall training.

Distribution of Maternity Allowance

Nirdhan distributes maternity allowance to its maternity clients in a regular basis. Maternity period is a very sensitive period for mothers and they need nutritious food to keep themselves and their child healthy. To help the same cause Nirdhan provides Rs. 1,100 to its maternity clients for up to 2 times to each client.

Nirdhan distributed 265 maternity allowances during Aug-Sep 2019 amounting to a total of Rs. 291.5 thousand to maternity clients through different branches.

Distribution of Disaster Reliefs

Nirdhan distributes Relief to the members who are affected by natural calamities such as flood, landslide, earthquake, tornado, fire etc. During Aug-Sep 2019, Nirdhan distributed 1,519 reliefs amounting to Rs. 1.88 million. These reliefs were provided to the victims of landslide and flood mainly in the terai region. The amount of relief distributed to the members depend on the damage caused to them and their household.

Distribution of Compensation

Alongside, maternity allowances & reliefs, Nirdhan also distributes compensations in the event of death or accidents of its member clients to their family who were insured through the micro-insurance service facilitated by Nirdhan Utthan LBSL. Nirdhan distributed 146 compensations during Aug-Sep 2019 amounting to a total of Rs. 9.58 million to the family of deceased clients through its different branches across the country. Nirdhan Utthan provides the insurance facilities to its clients through cooperation with the best value major insurance company in the market. The insurance premiums charged to the clients are negotiated by Nirdhan to offer value without compromising on the benefits offered by the insurance to its clients.

Janaki Rai, a Single Women, Enjoying Goat Farming Business

This is a story of 39 years old Janaki Rai who lives in Ward No. 17, Hetauda Sub-Metropolitan, Makawanpur District and is known for her goat farming business. Her business started with 2 goats. Currently she has a farmhouse which can house up to 50 goats. She has 20 mother goats in her farm. She earns Rs. 300-400 thousand every year by selling goats. From the income of this business, she has bought 1-kattha land, her elder daughter is studying staff nurse and her younger daughter is studying in a boarding school. As the goat farming enhanced her economy, she is planning to expand her goat farming business in the near future.

She was born in 1979 in an extremely poor family in Hatiya, Makawanpur. She had the desire to study but she didn't get a chance to study further than 5th grade due to her parents' weak economic condition. At the age of 16, she got married. Her husband worked as a labor. She gave birth to 3 children. The expenses increased after her children's birth and her husband's income were not enough to cover household expenses. Her husband died 4 years ago and she had to find an income source to run her family. She thought

she had to do something and started rearing 2 goats for half income sharing with the owner.

In 2013, she became member of a group formed by Nirdhan and took her first loan of Rs. 20 thousand to pay off the owner of the goats and became owner of 2 goats. As her goat farming was making good progress, she gradually took further loans from Nirdhan and added more goats and built a bigger farmhouse for goats. Currently she has a loan of Rs. 70 thousand with which she has bought 4 hybrid varie-

ty of goats for her farm. She expects more profit from hybrid goats compared to traditional goats. She believes that she will earn more from the hybrid goats.

She said, "A single poor woman like me became able to make earnings through goat farming because of collateral free loan provided by Nirdhan. I became able to school my children. When no one trusted me, Nirdhan trusted me and today I am trusted by everyone."
